The purpose of this meeting is to present the Kenneth F. Burns Memorial Bridge Replacement project and the different types of bridge alternatives being evaluated as part of the design process and to present the Environmental Notification Form (ENF). The ENF was filed with the Massachusetts Environmental Policy Act Office (MEPA) on August 16, 2010. Following an introduction by MEPA staff, and the presentation, MassDOT staff will lead a discussion to answer questions and gather public comment on the ENF and other aspects of the project. Interested parties are encouraged to submit comments about the ENF and the project in writing to the MEPA Office. All views and comments received at the meeting will be carefully reviewed and considered to the maximum extent possible.

The replacement of the Kenneth F. Burns Memorial Bridge, which carries Route 9 over Lake Quinsigamond between Worcester and Shrewsbury, is being conducted under the Commonwealth's Accelerated Bridge Program (ABP). This is one of most significant projects being undertaken by MassDOT under the ABP and when completed, will create a replacement bridge on a similar alignment as the current span.
